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Wealth Builder Bucket – Aggressive Growth

Investment Objective: Maximize compound returns with a concentrated portfolio of legacy or high-conviction allocations. Concentrated, high-octane exposure to the top names across stock and Exchange Traded Fund (ETF) universes. Combines machine learning-driven equity selection with hedge fund-like tactical tracking and boosted ETF overlays. Suited for long-term, patient investors with a tolerance for volatility.

Boosted Stock Model – 15

This *Battle Royale* based strategy is powered by a proprietary machine learning algorithm built for sophisticated financial analysis. The algorithm scans the Russell 1000, conducting head-to-head comparisons between companies to assess relative strength based on risk-adjusted performance. By ranking companies on the number of “battles” won, it identifies those stocks demonstrating consistent leadership across multiple factors. The result is a focused portfolio of 10 to 15 high-conviction holdings — concentrated enough to impact performance yet diversified enough to manage risk. This disciplined, AI-driven process offers a repeatable framework for identifying market leaders based on data, not prediction.

Hedge Fund Tracker Top 10 Model

This strategy sources stock selections from quarterly 13F filings by select hedge funds, captured approximately 45 days after quarter-end, typically mid-February, May, August, and November. The model is reconstituted with this lag and occasionally rebalanced to equal weight. Eligible hedge funds must have assets under management (AUM) over \$3.5 billion and have outperformed the S&P 500 Total Return since 2008 and over the past 3 years — a criteria narrowing the reviewed universe to approximately 40 hedge funds. The top 10 stocks are selected using a Combined Percent of Portfolio approach, summing each position’s portfolio weight across all qualifying filers. ETFs, options, and short positions are excluded.

Boosted ETF Model

Our global ETF strategy is also powered by our *Battle Royale* strategy. In this instance, our proprietary machine learning algorithm evaluates 131 ETFs spanning asset classes, geographies, sectors, styles, and factors. This advanced model cuts through market noise to assess each ETF’s relative performance through head-to-head comparisons, with a focus on risk-adjusted return potential. From this broad universe, the strategy selects the top 2 to 4 ETFs that demonstrate the strongest alignment with our investment objectives. ETF Strategic - 100/0

This allocation seeks moderately aggressive capital appreciation in excess of IFP Asset Management's (IFPAM) aggressive benchmark by employing a long-term investing approach. Aggressive portfolios typically target a diversified allocation mix of 100% equity and 0% fixed income ETF holdings.

Boosted Stock Model - 50

This investment strategy is powered by our *Battle Royale* process; a proprietary machine learning algorithm built for advanced equity analysis. It evaluates each company in the Russell 1000 through head-to-head comparisons, ranking them based on risk-adjusted performance across a range of inputs. The portfolio holds 45 to 50 top-ranked stocks, offering broader diversification than our concentrated model while still reflecting high-conviction insights. This disciplined, data-driven approach is designed to manage volatility and provide exposure to consistent performers across the U.S. equity landscape.

Boosted ETF Model

Our global ETF strategy is also powered by our *Battle Royale* strategy. Each month, the top 2 ETFs are selected, with flexibility to hold up to 4 if prior positions remain in the top 4—limiting turnover and enhancing stability. Allocations are equally weighted to ensure balanced exposure. This disciplined, data-driven process seeks to capture global growth while actively managing risk through thoughtful rebalancing.

Adaptive Asset Allocation

The Adaptive Asset Allocation strategy combines momentum with a minimum variance portfolio to trade a diverse array of global asset classes. The strategy analyzes the 6-month (126-day) return for 10 different asset classes. The model then selects the top 5 assets with the highest return over the look back period and then optimizes the weights for each position by finding the weights corresponding to the minimum variance portfolio. *TDM 8.6.2025*

Short Term Bucket - Delayed Income

Investment Objective: Preserve capital, generate stable income, and maintain flexibility to raise cash without forced losses. This bucket acts as a cash refill reserve with low-to-moderate risk, designed to weather adverse markets while generating real income. 5 Year Investment Grade Corporate iBond Ladder

The strategy deploys an equal weight, five year ladder of iShares iBond Investment Grade Corporate Bond Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) with maturities within this bucket's intended timeline.

Tactical Bond Strategy

The Tactical Bond Strategy is a quantitative rotation strategy that selects the top three income oriented options based on momentum, from a curated universe of fixed income investments. The strategy also has the ability to go to ultra-short duration treasuries in risk-off fixed income environments.

High Income ETF Rotation Strategy

Our High Income ETF Rotation Strategy targets high-performing income-oriented asset classes, leveraging a sophisticated algorithm to select from a diverse set of 12 individual high income ETFs. Every month, the algorithm evaluates these ETFs based on key metrics such as price oscillation, trend analysis, recovery from lows, volatility-adjusted momentum over 12 months, and the relative position of the 21-day simple moving average to the 200-day average with the top 2 ETFs selected. To maintain portfolio stability and minimize transaction costs, any ETF ranking within the top 4 is retained for the following month, with replacements introduced only if necessary. Diversified Income Hybrid Taxable

To provide current income in excess of the IFP Asset Management's (IFPAM) benchmark without sacrificing excess return potential. The model invests in income producing mutual funds and exchange traded products, including those focused on fixed income, dividend paying equities, and income producing liquid alternatives. The model is intended for non-qualified, taxable, accounts, as a portion of the portfolio is typically invested in tax-free income producing securities, under normal circumstances.

Defined Outcome ETF Strategy - Timeless

This portfolio uses defined outcome Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs), diversified across major equity asset classes, to help reduce entry-point timing risk and measured loss potential. These ETFs use options strategies that buffer downside losses in exchange for capped upside potential—offering a more controlled risk-return profile.

ETF Passive - 100/0

Seeks to provide a low cost, tax efficient, globally diversified portfolio with minimal tracking error to IFPAM's aggressive benchmark. Aggressive portfolios typically target an allocation mix of 100% equity and 0% fixed income ETFs.

Focused Dividend Yield Model

IFPAM's Focused Dividend Yield strategy targets U.S. companies with the highest sustainable dividend yields. From the top 900 U.S. stocks by market cap, the model selects 30 with the highest trailing 12-month yields — subject to payout ratio limits and a minimum 3-year dividend history. To promote diversification, sector exposure is capped at 25%, and all positions are equally weighted. The portfolio rebalances annually each October, with interim replacements if a company ceases dividend payments. This disciplined approach emphasizes consistent income and long-term sustainability.
